Our next in-person event will be held on **Saturday 01/04/2023** at Hamilton Claypits NR from **10:00 – 16:00**. This site is a great example of how community action for nature can grow into a thriving nature reserve in an area that was previously derelict. The day will consist of a walking tour of the reserve where we will learn about how the community came to take ownership over this site and the projects they have run. After a lunch break (lunch will be provided) we will spend the afternoon carrying out some wildlife surveying around the reserve.
